Re Edward Dodd, Joseph Phippen, Delmar Bent

Dear Mr. Johnson:

We have nothing at all about Delmar Bent, Betsey Phippen's husband. See separate sheets for Joseph Phippen, who married Mitty Hooker, and for Edward Dodd.

As Mrs. Edward C. Dodd relates, one of the Angelica pioneers was Edward Dodd. His first land, 24.64 acres was surveyed for him by Moses VanCampeb September 30 1805, he signed his articles October 7 1805, and was given his deed April 24 1807. The tract owner, Philip Church, charged him \$73.92 for the 24.64 acres. His lot was 31 chains from the survey center of the village plat. His deeds are recorded in Allegany County Clerk's Office in Liber A at page 70, Liber C at page 174, and Liber I at page 673.

There are no town records of the date of birth of his children and no state or federal censuses which would enumerate all his family before 1850 and, of course, he died in 1839. In the 1850 census town of Angelica the only Dodd is as follows:

The 1855 census town of Angelica says:

Nancy Dodd	70	F	Pauper Unknown	Widowed	14 yrs

Probably Nancy Phippen Dodd died at the County Home and was buried either in the burying ground in back of the Home or in 'Til the Day Dawn Cemetery. In either case the county would not have used a headstone giving name and dates, only a number. The record which gave the name for each number were destroyed when the County Home burned.

Dear Mr. Lambert:

We have little on Betsey Ann Holcomb. She would have been 24 at the time of the 1850 census of West Almond, the earliest census in which the names of all members of the family of Levi and Harriet Holcomb were given.

In the 1855 census the first names of some of Levi and Harriet's children are illegible to me. If you wish I will have a photocopy of this page in the book made for you to decipher.

For Edward Dodd, we have the survey notes of Moses VanCampen who, on September 30 1805, surveyed the first 24 acres Edward purchased from the tract owner, Philip Church. We have the record of the signing of his articles for the parcel on October 7 1805. Of course the deed was recorded in Liber of Deeds A at page 70. We can abstract this for you if you wish and can give you a copy of a map of the village of Angelica August 3 1827, showing this parcel marked "E. Dodd".

After reading Mrs. Edward C. Dodd IV article, we are mystified that Edward does not appear in a list of members of St. Paul's Angelica 1827 prepared by the then Rector William W. Bostwick.

The county historian is away this week so I was unable to get a look at the 1820, 30, or 40 censuses which, of course, are heads of family only. Will try later.

Dear Mr. Stone

I received your letter with all the information I requested on the Edward Dodd and Levi Holcomb families. You did much work researching the records for this information, and I appreciate it very much.

You included a history of Edward Dodd written by Mrs. Edward C. Dodd. I was very glad to get this. After carefully studying this article, I am convinced in my own mind that she left out one generation. It states Edward Dodd, Sr. was born in 1755. He arrived in Angelica about 1800. He married Nancy Phippen, born in 1795, and his first son, Edward, was born in 1820 with two sons born later. Edward, Sr. would have been sixty-five years old in 1820. This doesn't seem reasonable to me. Edward, Sr. would have been about forty-five years old when he came to Angelica. I believe he already had a family with a son named Edward, 2nd. To support my belief, the 1830 census lists an Edward Dodd 50-60, a wife 30-40 — the age for Nancy Phippen and three sons in the right age bracket. Edward, Sr. would be seventy-five years old in 1830. Would you please check this out for me.

The 1850 census lists a Henry Dodd of Angelica (poor house). Would he be a son of Edward, Sr.? Were there any other Dodds on record about this time? Mrs. Dodd also mentioned that Betsy Ann Holcomb came from Holcombeville, England. Betsy Ann was born at Lisle, Broome County, New York, February, 1826, daughter of Levi and Harriet Holcomb. Our earliest ancestor in America was Thomas Holcombe. He was born in Lancastershire, England, son of Sir Gilbert Holcombe. He came to America in 1630 and settled in Dorchester, Massachusetts. He later moved to Windsor, Connecticut.

You mentioned in your letter about the sale of 24 acres of land from Philip Church to Edward Dodd October 7, 1805 — Deeds A at Page 70. Yes, I would like a copy of this plus the map of Angelica showing the spot marked "E. Dodd." In 1855 a George W. Thomas sold a parcel to William Dodd. Do you have any information on George W. Thomas? I would also like information on Enoch Banks who in 1837 sold a parcel to Levi Holcomb.

I hope I am not asking too much from you. I appreciate all your help. If there is any charge for the above information, please include a statement.

Dear Mr. Lambert:

When I read Mrs. Edward C. Dodd's article what came to mind was the possibility that perhaps she or the printer had erred in giving the year of Edward Dodd's birth as 1855. I had decided to have a look at that window in St. Paul's Angelica. The year 1875 would fit better, both the 1830 census and the relative ages of Edward and Nancy at the time of their marriage. If the date on the window is other than 1855 I will let you know.

For information on Henry H Dodd try Mrs Keith Warren, Box 1, Richland, Missouri 65556. She has Nov 7 1822 as date of birth and December 28 1880 as date of death at Camden County, Missouri. She also says that the 1850 census lists a Henry Dodd at the poor house at Angelica. County Historian William C Greene could not find it in our 1850 census here at the County Clerk's Office when he wrote her about four years ago. He could not find Henry H. Dodd anywhere, nor could I. We both found Nancy Dodd at the county home (poorhouse) in 1850 and in 1855 but not in 1860. We both assumed that she died at the county home before 1860. If Edward died August 15 1839, the 1840 census of heads of family might show a Nancy Dodd. If your Henry H Dodd was a son of Edward, it appears that your 1830 census should have shown an Edward Dodd 50-60, a wife 30-40, and four sons in the right age bracket. The Wellsville library has the film of the 1850 census and the 1850 census book in the Clerk's Office at Belmont is probably a transcription, so I will check the film at the first opportunity.

It appears that Enoch Hanks and Levi Holcomb lived quite close together in the western part of the present town of West Almond. If they were there in 1830 it would show in census of Angelica. In 1840 the same place would be in census for town of West Almond.

Dear Mr Lambert:

The Federal census of 1820 for state of New York, county of Allegany, town of Angelica, heads of family only, shows no Henry Dodd and the family of Edward Dodd contained one male age 45 or older and no females, the number of persons engaged in agriculture being one. Of the several age brackets for males only the last, i.e. 45 and older, contained any number. Doesn't it appear from this that Edward Dodd, as yet unmarried to Nancy Phippen, was living on the 24 acres of land on the south side of present Elizabeth Street articulated from John B Church October 7 1805? It is too bad that there was not another age bracket for males 65 and older because then we would know whether this is the Edward Dodd, Sr. b1755 mentioned in Mrs. Edward C Dodd's piece in Angelica Collectanea.

As you mention, the 1830 family of Edward Dodd has the right number of sons under 5, i.e. William and John, and sons 5 to 10, i.e. Edward, and indicates that the head of family (Edward Dodd) was born between 1770 and 1780. He doubtless is in Section 2 Block 1 of Until the Day Dawn Cemetery here but there is no headstone and no written record. There is no Henry Dodd in the 1830 heads of family census.

In the 1840 heads of family census for Angelica there is no Dodd at all. We did not expect to find Edward, what with Mrs. Edward C. Dodd's statement that he died August 15 1839, but thought Nancy Dodd might be shown as head of family. She was not, nor were any of the three sons. Her absence might be explained by the 1855 census at the County Home stating that she had been resident there for 14 years.

The film of the 1850 census (at Wellsville Library) enumerates the residents at the County Home, among whom were:

One might think the "Nancy" in the courthouse census book is the census-taker's chirographical error except for gender given "Henry" in the film at the library. Perhaps the clerk who copied the 1850 census into the book now in the clerk's office knew that the given name should be Nancy instead of Henry. In any case, the 1855 census at the County Home shows no Henry Dodd but does show:

Nancy Dodd F age 70 Pauper Born Alleg. Co., Widowed, Here 14 yrs, Insane  
The 1860 census at County Home shows no Nancy Dodd and no Henry Dodd.

A member of St John's Angelica is going to check the date of Edward, Sr.'s birth given on that stained glass window and let me know. Will report.

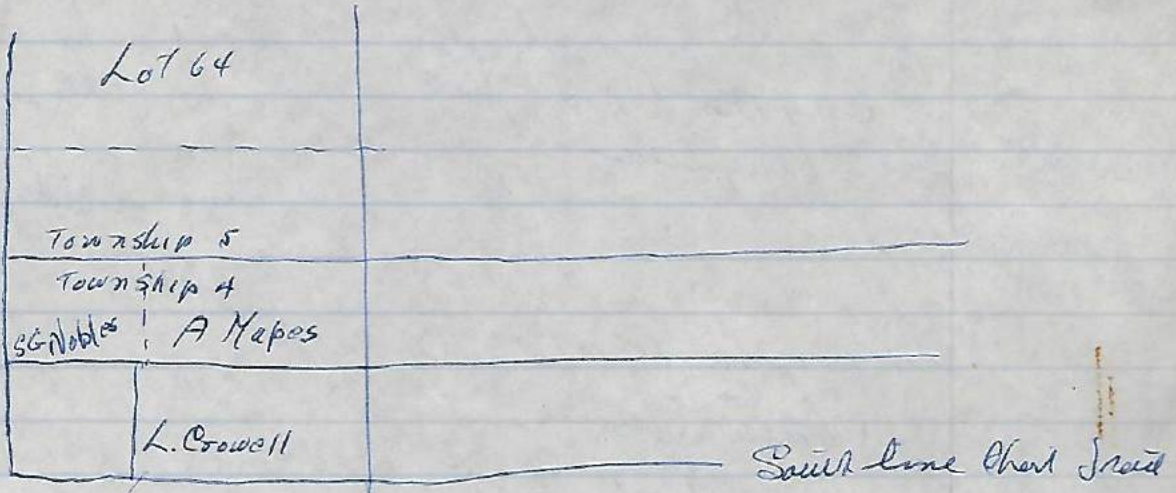

Edward Dodd Family

(Written by Mrs. Edward C. Dodd)

Edward Dodd, one of Angelica's pioneers, was born in Lancashire, England in the year 1755, and settled in this country, in Angelica, N. Y. in the early 1800s. He was a freeholder and served on the first town board in 1805. The first land he purchased was at 10 a.m. April 24 1807, for \$1 he got 24.54 acres, and in 1822 he purchased 10.75 acres for \$72.50 and in 1833 he purchased, on November 19th, his last tract of land of 47.35 acres for \$212.50. All this land was purchased from Philip Church. Mr. Dodd served as path-master in Angelica in 1826 and 1827. He was a devoted Episcopalian and deeply versed in the knowledge of the English church and was one of the first lay readers of St. Paul's Angelica. His sons Edward, William and John were the first children to be baptised in the church. The church burned in 1847, eight years after his death but was rebuilt in 1848. There are many beautiful memorial windows now in the church, there being one given by the Rev. Charles Hasting Dodd, D.D., pastor of the Second Baptist Church of Philadelphia, Pa. Reading on the window is:

Edward Dodd Sr. married Miss Nancy Phippen who was a member of the Methodist faith and was one of the first ladies to speak in the Methodist pulpit in this section of the country. Mr. Dodd helped set out the many beautiful trees in the park. These are standing today as a living memorial to the men who made Angelica what she is today - a clean, quite prosperous town with many beautiful churches of various faiths, and a school. What more could your heart desire? These are the surroundings in which Mr. Dodd brought up his three sons to prosperous business men. John married Hannah and settled in Shinglehouse, Pa., and some of his children married and moved as far away as Santa Monica, California. His son John was born May 27 1866. He married and has only two daughters. Died in 1953 at California. William married Harriet Knapp of Angelica and in 1860 he moved his family on a farm on Sweden Hill near the county seat of Potter county, Coudersport, Pa. William was born in Angelica, Jan, 12 1830, died July 26 1897, leaving a son William B. He died in 1935, leaving a son who still owns the old homestead. Edward Dodd, Jr. married Betsey of Holcomb, who came from Holcombeville, England. Two this union were born eight boys and two girls, one boy and one girl dying young. He settled in Almond and was a tin and copper smith by trade. Allegany county census records of June 1855 show Edward Dodd, age 33, tinner. His wife Betsey, born in Broome county, N. Y. Children; John R. age 8, William H., 6, Edward L., 4 and Sherman O. age 1 year. In the year 1861 he moved his business to Coudersport, Pa. Later he settled on a farm he cleared at Sweden Valley where he lived until his death in 1913. The farm is known as the "Glen Mary Farm". Here is where he raised his seven boys and one girl, Mrs. Mary Dodd Lyon being the last to die, at the age of 96 years, in 1953. Of this union remains one son, Edward C. Dodd IV, son of John R. Dodd. The first son of Edward Dodd Jr., Edward C. Dodd has a grandson, Edward R. Dodd, VI, both of whom live in Buffalo, N. Y.
